I. President's Executive Order April 27, 2004

- Created position of National Health IT Coordinator in HHS
 - David Brailer MD, PhD
 - Reports to HHS Secretary
 - New Office in HHS
- Responsible for
 - Coordinating all Federal and private sector efforts toward NHII

- Strategic Plan in 90 days
- OPM incentives report in 90 days
- VA and DoD report in 90 days

- Goal 1 Inform Clinical Practice
 - Incentivize electronic health record (EHR) adoption
 - Reduce risk of EHR investment
 - Promote EHR diffusion in rural and underserved areas



- Goal 2 Interconnect Clinicians
 - Foster regional collaborations
 - Develop a national health information network
 - Coordinate federal health information systems



- Goal 3 Personalize Care
 - Encourage use of Personal Health Records
 - Enhance informed consumer choice
 - Promote use of telehealth systems

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- Goal 4 Improve Population Health
 - Unify public health surveillance architectures
 - Steamline quality and health status monitoring
 - Accelerate research and dissemination of evidence



Office of Personnel Management (OPM) Report

- Options to provide incentives in the Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Program to promote adoption of interoperable health information technology
- FEHB group health insurance program covers 8 million people



Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Department of Defense (DoD) Reports

 Approaches to make health information systems available and affordable to rural and medically underserved communities



Framework Implementation – 3 Phases:

- 1. Development of market institutions
- 2. Investment in clinical management tools and capabilities
- 3. Market transition to robust quality and performance accountability
