  - license proliferation
- Perceived Issues on "Openness"
  - can/should we block access from certain jurisdictions
  - license compatibility
  - lacking standards to enable deployment as open systems
- Perceived Issues on "IP Provenance"
  - vetting becomes a barrier to contributing
  - provenance of axioms may be hard to determine
  - scope of due diligence on IP is not appreciated

- all attempts to determine shares of intellectual property proved both expensive and futile
- "half open" license continues to be a major issue and cost of dealing with
- IP is intimately related to funding models
