Ontolog and Ontology-Based Standards: History

- Ontolog Forum was founded in April, 2002: Peter Yim, Kurt Conrad, Leo Obrst (co-convenors)
- Our initial activity was to promote ontologies to support the emerging OASIS Universal Business Language (UBL) standard: [Ontolog Charter](#)
 - We presented Overview of Ontologies to UBL Technical Committee, May, 2002: Leo Obrst, Jack Park, Peter Yim
 - Led to UBL ontology effort by Ontolog
- First Ontology Summit: 2006
