
Where is the Library?

Subcollections

- Single Item may belong to multiple sub-collections without duplication
- Added in response to how materials are presented or for ease of access
- Arrows indicate presence of subfolders. Click arrow to display.



Library and Bibliographic Functions

- Library function: for digital, public domain materials:
 - May include copy of item as attachment
 - May include link to download Entries may also include notes capturing supplemental info (e.g., comments from community member, recommendation, why item is included)
- Bibliographic function: for all materials:
 - Standard bibliographic information is provided, tailored to item type.
 - Bibliography can be exported (may formats supported)
- Notes attachments
 - May be added by any community member
 - May call attention to something of specific interest, explain why item was added, comment...

Communique Reference collections

- New this year: use library to support gathering of items for particular reference needs in communique
- Where set of summit materials & others are relevant to a communique point, footnote points directly to sub-collection.

How to Use

- Browse and search online, no login required
- Get a zotero.org login (free), join group, and contribute:
 - add & edit items, attachments, notes, subcollections, tags
 - continue to grow the collection (and subcollections), even after summit ends
 - share updated and new resources across community
